Information

- We will provide access to impartial (non-biased) information, advice and guidance about your future.
 - We will help you access all the information you need to make the right choices in Y9, Y11 and at sixth form.
 - We will help you to make sense of this information and link it to your preferences.

Careers learning

- From Y7 to Y13, you will have career education activities through Ethics or study/tutor time to help you understand your options after school, the world of work, the job market and the skills you might need for the future.
- We will help you to link what you learn in your subjects at school to careers and the workplace.

Advice

- You will always have someone to talk to about your future plans, for example, your form tutor or the careers team at Meadowhead.
- Whichever year group you are in, you can request a meeting to talk through your options with a fully-qualified, impartial careers adviser.
 - If you prefer, you can talk to an adviser who is independent of the school.
 - You can ask your parents to attend these meetings too.
- We will help you to develop your own personal action plan.

Experiences

- Throughout your time at school, you'll have chance to gain work experience; meet employers, education and training providers and universities; and have a go at work-related activities.

Parents and carers

- We know it is important for parents and carers to be involved, so we will invite them to events and encourage you to talk to them about your decisions.
