

Year 6/7 Transition 2021

There are many positive benefits of face to face visits for the mental health and wellbeing of children, especially at the point of transition. Our planning for Year 6/7 transition will be carefully planned using COVID-19 secure guidelines. The Public Health team has advised Sheffield Schools that it is possible for transition visits to go ahead where appropriate measures are taken and guidance followed. At the time of the visits if the Delta variant is showing to be a real concern in the locality then PHS will inform us of this and face to face plans will no longer take place.

COVID-19 Risk Assessment for School/Childcare Settings System of controls

We know that the predominant new variant of coronavirus (COVID-19) is more transmissible however, PHE advice remains that the way to control this virus is with the system of controls, even with the current new variants.

In this risk assessment where something is essential for public health reasons, as advised by Public Health England (PHE), we have said 'must'. Where there is a legal requirement, we have made that clear. This guidance does not create any new legal obligations.

The set of actions we must take are grouped into 'prevention' and 'response to any infection'. These are the system of controls.

By following the system of controls, we will effectively reduce risks in our setting and create an inherently safer environment.

These additional measures will be reviewed in partnership with health experts to decide whether evidence suggests that these measures can be eased at any point in the summer term.

Prevention

We must always:

- 1) Minimise contact with individuals who are required to self-isolate by ensuring they do not attend the school.
- 2) Ensure face coverings are used in recommended circumstances.
- 3) Ensure everyone is advised to clean their hands thoroughly and more often than usual.
- 4) Ensure good respiratory hygiene for everyone by promoting the 'catch it, bin it, kill it' approach.
- 5) Maintain enhanced cleaning, including cleaning frequently touched surfaces often, using standard products such as detergents.
- 6) Consider how to minimise contact across the site and maintain social distancing wherever possible.
- 7) Keep occupied spaces well ventilated.

In specific circumstances:

- 8) Ensure individuals wear the appropriate personal protective equipment (PPE) where necessary.
- 9) Promote and engage in asymptomatic testing, where available.
