As part of the ERASMUS JOB SHADOWING PROJECT, Mr Raju and Mrs Evans spent time at the San Valero School in Zaragoza, Spain observing how specific subjects such as Mathematics and Technology were being taught abroad.

This falls under the bigger remit of increasing student participation within the STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics) subjects at Meadowhead School Academy Trust.

Their visit also focused on how vocational learning and training were been delivered at the school. A similar trip also took place in Koblenz, Germany and involved Mr Ludlum and Ms Alcock. Here, they observed an impressive Y7 class who were taught Maths entirely in English! Some of the English used in the Biology class was too complicated for Mr Ludlam! Next term will continue with 4 weeks of Science, followed by family cooking to round off the year. Feedback from parents has been very positive with families seeing improved confidence levels, learning new skills and parents experiencing different ways of learning with their child.



On Friday 6th February our Year 7 pupils left school for the annual residential trip to the Kingswood Centre in Staffordshire

There were 6 coaches, 24 Meadowhead staff, 234 pupils, 15 Kingswood instructors and one year of prior planning in order to make this trip run successfully.



The whole trip was, again, a great success, with the majority of pupils trying something new and/or doing something they didn't think they'd be able to do. They all had a go at climbing, abseiling, zip wire, caving, obstacle courses, team building and archery.

We all arrived home safe and well, but exhausted, on Sunday afternoon. There was only one casualty: Oliver Anderson broke his arm whilst playing football on the yard. He was taken to hospital but was desperate to come back to Kingswood to be with his mates!
