Online Tandem Learning Programme

10 gifted and talented linguists from our Y11 GCSE French, German and Spanish groups attended a languages conference at Hull University in the autumn term entitled Going Global: Communication in an Inter-Dependent Globe. After trying their hand at interpreting, global language tasters and a campus tour led by undergraduate students, they were invited to enrol on a new online tandem learning project in the Spring Term. All students were paired up online with a native graduate of the language they had chosen, and 'conversed' online for a 6 week period on topics related to their GCSE and interests to help improve their global communication skills and Intercultural knowledge. All students completed the course and received a certificate of merit from the MFL dept at Hull University.

First German Exchange

Following the first leg of this new exchange programme when German students visited Meadowhead earlier in the spring term, 11 GCSE German students embarked upon our first return visit to our partner school in Koblenz at the end of June, led by our Head of German. Students enjoyed their complete immersion into German family life, attending lessons, and visiting places of interest.

New Finnish Partner School

In February 2 teachers from our Learning support undertook a British council funded 'preparatory visit' to our new partner school in Klaukkala, Finland to plan a new joint curriculum project involving our students with learning difficulties and disabilities. The hospitality shown by our Finnish partners was second to none, and we look forward to some exciting work, future student visits and videoconferencing in the near future!

In the mornings, students enjoyed 4 hours of French classes in groups of 9 provided by Actilangue Language School, and cultural visits in the afternoon, including a trip to Monaco, led by 2 of our French teachers.

We also run a Japanese Society after school and have provided taster sessions to feeder primary schools which have proved extremely popular.


Chinese club

Sri Lankan partner school teacher exchange visits

In February, 2 more of our teachers visited our Muslim partner school in Balapitiya, Sri Lanka, as part of our British council DFID global schools partnership programme. They had a fantastic time teaching RE and PSHE to Sri Lankan students in the school by day, and enjoyed visiting the elephant orphanage and Turtle sanctuary at the weekend. In May, we welcomed the Sri Lankan Head Teacher and 2 other teachers to Meadowhead, for a 2 week stay. They attended lessons, judged a special Sri Lankan Art competition and even led assemblies about Sri Lanka to the whole school!! They also brought genuine artefacts for our enterprise students to sell on a stall to raise money for much needed computer facilities at their school. We now look forward to our 3rd year of the programme, to develop more joint curriculum project work and teacher training for their school.

Business Language Champions 2009

In conjunction with our fantastic manufacturing business partner Gripple Ltd, 15 of our Y10 talented linguists formed our business language champion group this year. They worked tirelessly after school to create information packs for Business Language NVQ students who visit the company to learn more about international business and why they use French, German and Spanish at work.

They also translated corporate PowerPoint presentations from English into their target language which enabled them to learn more business and technical vocabulary, something which they don't normally learn in their GCSE course. All students were presented with a certificate of merit by Gripple office sales manager on their final visit to the company in June, and were invited to a celebration evening of bowling and a special meal courtesy of Gripple and the Language College.



French for Primary school teachers

In conjunction with a local language agency Babble & Speak, we also offered a free French course for primary staff in the city who are keen to brush up on their skills to help support the teaching of French at KS1-2. Feedback has been very positive and all participants are now armed with a better knowledge of the language as well as lots of new resources and games to support their French teaching from September onwards.

Primary Spanish Hungry Caterpillar project!

We continue to support our feeder schools with their delivery of French, German and Spanish at KS2 throughout the year. Many projects take place to enrich their language learning and support Y6-7 transition, and this year one of these included a Videoconference between Sir Harold Jackson school and Meadowhead where we told the story of the Hungry Caterpillar in Spanish!

Our adult evening classes flourished again in the autumn/spring terms with over 200 adult members attending 7 languages – French, Italian, German, Spanish, Russian, Greek and Mandarin. In the summer term, we offered 6 week holiday tasters in French, Spanish, Italian and Greek, where adults also enjoyed getting to grips with the basics in time for their holidays.
