Welcome to **Meadowhead Sixth Form**

More amazing results in 2024!

We trust that this prospectus and our website will provide you with a comprehensive overview of what is on offer at Meadowhead.

Meadowhead is an excellent Sixth Form, with outstanding facilities, located in the South West of Sheffield. We are the Sixth Form of first choice for the vast majority of students in the area, and our welcoming approach and proven track record of academic success is attracting more and more students from other schools. Once again, over 90% of Meadowhead's top achieving Y11s chose to stay on to Sixth Form, and we welcomed record numbers of Y12s in September.

Due to our size we are able to offer a wide range of academic and vocational subjects, appropriate to student needs and interests, whilst maintaining small class sizes of 12-16 on average.

In 2023, we were rated in the top 3 state Sixth Forms in South Yorkshire based on students' grades. In 2024, students continued to excel. At A Level, around a third of entries achieved either an A* or A grade and 62% of entries were grade B or above. 23% of students achieved the elite measure of at least AAB with at least 2 facilitating subjects (well above the 2023 national state school average of 15.8%). Across the six BTEC subjects, the average grade was again a Distinction. This highlights that the teaching and facilities at Meadowhead are of the highest quality. This, combined with our outstanding care, guidance and support, meant that over 90% of students went to their first choice university, including two students who earnt themselves a place at Oxford.

The opportunities we provide are first class. Meadowhead Together consists of our feeder primary schools, Sheffield College, both universities in Sheffield and 21 local and national business partners. Our day-to-day school life is enriched by visits and activities to provide our students with incredible career opportunities and to improve life chances. These links are particularly helpful to those who choose to follow a more vocational pathway in the Sixth Form.

Meadowhead's impressive facilities provide students with a universitystyle learning environment, including 11 bespoke classrooms, a private study area and a suite of brand new laptops. This helps students to develop independence and discipline in their learning.

Our enrichment programme

Alongside high-quality teaching and learning in their chosen subjects, students also take part in our unique enrichment programme.

During Year 12, students complete modules in the following

- Work Experience (one week)
- University visit days (at least two days)
- School or Community Volunteering (at least five hours)
- Extra-curricular hobby or skill (at least ten hours)
- Supercurricular reading and research (at least five hours)

Students will be supported through these modules during Tutor Time and Form Time.

For the work experience module, we engage with over 50 well-known local and multinational employers to provide high-quality placements in a wide variety of industry sectors: engineering & construction, sports & leisure, hospitality & catering, legal & financial, business administration and education. During Year 13, students will be supported in applying for university, apprenticeships or employment. As well as being incredibly beneficial for personal development, these activities also support successful applications.

Information, advice and guidance

All Sixth Form students belong to a tutor group with a dedicated tutor. Tutor groups are arranged by discipline to enable targeted advice and guidance from a subject specialist; students are placed in a tutor group with peers who are studying similar subjects.

The Head of Sixth Form works with a team of dedicated staff to support and guide all students. Along with their tutor, each student will be supported by their Head of Year, a Pastoral Manager and the Academic Support Manager. Throughout Years 12 and 13, students receive support and guidance to help them achieve their potential and to make the right choices when they leave Meadowhead. Students also have access to the school's experienced careers advisor who will meet with students regularly during their time with us to offer impartial advice and guidance.

Students and Sixth Form staff meet for a briefing on Tuesday morning and this is followed by a one hour tutorial. Here are some of the topics we cover during tutorial time and through our Ethics curriculum:

- · Introduction to progression options: university, employment, apprenticeship and gap years
- Support for applications to each of these routes
- Preparation for academic and employment interviews
- Citizenship and democracy: voting and politics
- Citizenship and democracy: meet the local MP
- Personal wellbeing: mental health, stress and anxiety
- Personal wellbeing: sexual health and healthy relationships
- Personal wellbeing: self-care and healthy eating
- Personal wellbeing: alcohol, drugs and managing risks
- Personal wellbeing: independent travel and safer driving
- Personal wellbeing: managing paid employment and student-workers' rights
- Study Skills: conducting research, referencing and plagiarism
- Study skills: revision strategies
- Study skills: giving a presentation
- Living independently: finances
- · Living independently: housing, landlords and renting





As a Sixth Form, we are proud of our extensive range of trips and visits. We hold an annual Leavers' Dinner at the Double Tree Hilton Hotel.

In recent years, trips and visits have included a Geography trip to Iceland, a History trip to Washington DC, a Science trip to CERN, and an enrichment trip to Canada. We run the Duke of Edinburgh award at Bronze and Silver levels and are looking to run a fully funded trip to Japan for qualifying students.

We work with the rest of the school to support events such as the annual Sports Day, the Everyone a Writer Celebration evening, drama performances and the Make a Difference awards. Sixth Formers also volunteer at events in our feeder Primary schools.





How to apply (2025 entry)

Students usually apply for Sixth Form during the autumn of Year 11. Our entry requirements ask that students achieve at least five subjects at grades 9-4 including English and Maths and usually at least a 5 (GCSE) or a Merit (BTEC) in their chosen subjects.

For some subjects, the entry requirements are higher. Students normally choose three subjects and study them for two years. If chosen, students with very high GCSE attainment (at least six 9-7 grades) may wish to study four subjects.
