## Key Assessment Information

- Featured as Section B (i) on Paper 2 so the focus of the question can be on any issue affecting Modern society (post-1945/WW2). 25 marks.
- The question will usually be worded as "Explore the significance of..."
- Potential key words: memory, difference, place, insecurity, isolation, deception, control, identity, rebellion, societal change, gender, conflict, morality, desire, dreams, power, storytelling, social class, death, violence, family, love and relationships, freedom, appearance, freedom, appearance,
- Read the information provided in the exam paper about the extract before you begin.
- Highlight areas of the text that refer directly to the key word. Re-read as many times as you need to understand the extract clearly.
- Number your highlighted evidence on your extract to form a plan.
- Begin with a clear opening thesis to start featuring the key word.
- Aim to write about four or five moments or methods in the text.
- Return to the key word and explain its significance to close your essay.
