

# Crime Knowledge Organiser

Term/Theme	Definition
Hate Crime	a crime, typically one involving violence, that is motivated by prejudice on the basis of race, religion, sexual orientation, or other
County Lines	is a very serious issue where criminal gangs from cities set up drug dealing operations outside their usual area
Acid Attack	are a form of violence, in which acid or another corrosive substance is thrown at a person - usually a woman or a girl - with the intention of maiming, torturing or killing them
Child Sexual Exploitation	is a type of sexual abuse. When a child or young person is exploited they're given things, like gifts, drugs, money, status and affection, in exchange for performing sexual activities.
Grooming	the action of preparing a child for a meeting, especially via an internet chat room, with the intention of committing a sexual offence.
CEOP	is a <b>law enforcement agency</b> and is here to help keep children and young people safe from sexual abuse and grooming online.
Criminal Exploitation	Is treating someone unfairly in order to benefit from their work. An example of this would be county lines.
Fearless	Fearless is a <b>service that allows you to pass on information about crime 100% anonymously</b> . This means you don't have to give us any personal details. Anonymity Promise.

## What to do if you witness an Acid Attack

1. Call 999
2. Any contaminated clothing needs to be very carefully removed from the victim, making sure that you don't get any of the substance on your own clothing or skin.
3. Do not pull off any clothing that has become stuck to the person.
4. Rinse the skin under water, paying particular attention to the face and eyes. Do this for a prolonged period of time.
5. Continue to rinse the skin until the emergency services arrive.

Make sure you know where you are going and how to get home. Always have charge on your phone.	Don't befriend people you don't know.
Stick with friends that are a similar age. Real friends will not ask you to do things that you are uncomfortable with.	Do not meet people in person that you have met online. Speak to a trusted adult if this is suggested to you.
Drinking and taking drugs can make you unaware of your surroundings and you can become a target for people to hurt you.	Keep your privacy settings as high as possible and never give out passwords.
