Grammar: Using adverbs to give extra detail

The following adverbs can be slotted into sentences to give an **opinion**:

- **gern (like)**
- **lieber (prefer)**
- **am liebsten (most like)**

The following adverbs can be used to give information about **how often** we do a particular activity:

- **oft (often)**
- **jeden Tag (every day)**
- **manchmal (sometimes)**
- **ab und zu (now and again)**
- **am Wochenende (at the weekend)**

In a sentence, we put adverbs after the verb (be careful – this is different to English).

verb ↓
e.g. ich spiele **gern** Tennis
↓ verb
Ich spiele **oft** Tennis
