## Saying what I eat and drink for breakfast

[*For breakfast*]

**je mange**

[*I eat*]

**je prends**

[*I have/ take*]

**il mange**

[*he eats*]

**elle mange**

[*she eats*]

**on mange** [*we eat*]

**je bois**

[*I drink*]

**il boit**

[*he drinks*]

**elle boit**

[*she drinks*]

**on boit**

[*we drink*]

**des céréales** [*some cereal*]

**du pain grillé** [*some toast*]

**un croissant** [*a croissant*]

**de la confiture** [*some jam*]

**un pain au chocolat** [*a pain au chocolat*]

**des fruits** [*some fruit*]

**du jus de pomme** [*some apple juice*]

**du café** [*some coffee*]

**du jus d'orange** [*some orange juice*]

**du thé** [*some tea*]

**de l'eau** [*some water*]

**du lait** [*some milk*]

**du chocolat chaud** [*some hot chocolate*]

### Grammar:

In English, we don't always use it but in French 'some' is always put into sentences when saying what we eat or drink

E.g.

Je mange **du** pain [I eat **some** bread]

Je bois **de** la confiture café [I eat **some** jam]

Je mange **des** céréales [I eat **some** cereal]

### Phonics: EU
