

HT3: Qu'est-ce que tu vas faire? What are you **going to** do...?

Normalement <i>[normally]</i> D'habitude <i>[Usually]</i> De temps en temps <i>[from time to time]</i>	je fais de la planche à voile <i>[I do windsurfing]</i> je fais du cheval <i>[I go horseriding]</i> je nage <i>[I swim]</i> je joue à l'ordinateur <i>[I play on the computer]</i> je fais du camping <i>[I go camping]</i> je fais une balade du vélo <i>[I do a bike ride]</i>	
Le week-end prochain <i>[next week]</i> L'année prochaine <i>[next year]</i> À l'avenir <i>[in the future]</i>	je vais <i>[I'm going to]</i> on va <i>[we are going to]</i>	faire ... <i>[to do...]</i> nager... <i>[to swim...]</i> jouer <i>[to play]</i> manger... <i>[to eat]</i> aller <i>[to go]</i>

TOP TIP:

When using 2 tenses at the same time, remember the following.

For a basic **present** tense sentence about what we do, we just need one verb after *je*

Je joue – I play

Je fais - I do

Je nage – I swim

The **future** tense needs two verbs: the verb **aller** + an **infinitive verb**.

To say what **I'm going to do** use **Je vais** + infinitive

Grammar

Infinitive verbs: An infinitive verb translates as **to do** something

e.g jouer = to play

finir = to finish

faire = to do

In French, you can spot an infinitive verb easily because it ends in **-er, -ir, -re**
