Grammar

Gender neutral pronouns

Spanish is a more gendered language than English, so it is more challenging to find ways to express non-binary identities. For example, there is no gender-neutral 'they' in Spanish (ellos/ellas).

Some people who identify as non-binary use the following as a gender-

neutral pronoun:

elle

Some people use other genderneutral pronouns, and others switch between pronouns.

Everyone is different, so it is always best to **ask the person** how they would like to be addressed

Common misconceptions: In Spanish pronouns typically come before the verb, so that the word order of sentences including pronouns can be very different to English.

E.g lo/la admiro (*him/her/it I admire*)

We would translate this as I admire him/her
