Grammar

Gender neutral pronouns
Spanish is a **more gendered** language than English, so it is more challenging to find ways to express non-binary identities. For example, there is **no gender-neutral 'they'** in Spanish (ellos/ellas).

Some people who identify as non-binary use the following as a gender-neutral pronoun:

elle

Some people use **other gender-neutral pronouns**, and others **switch between pronouns**.

Everyone is different, so it is always best to **ask the person** how they would like to be addressed

Common misconceptions: In Spanish pronouns typically come before the verb, so that the word order of sentences including pronouns can be very different to English.

E.g lo/la admiro (**him/her/it I admire**)

We would translate this as *I admire* **him/her**
