School Pastors Launch

Autumn Term 2019 We are very excited to be the pilot school in Sheffield for the School Pastors programme. We are currently working with eleven school pastors who are all volunteers from the local community connected to our local churches.

They come into school two afternoons a week to support our students during social time and provide mentoring for those who need someone to talk to. Alongside the mentors, we are also continuing with our well established Sixth Form peer mentor programme which gives our students in years 7-13 someone to talk to. We hosted an official launch for the programme on Thursday 24th October, with Tony Downing, Lord Mayor of Sheffield, as our Guest of Honour. There was a presentation delivered by two of our pastors explaining their roles and background to the concept of School Pastors. Mrs Grewal-Joy spoke of the very positive impact the programme had at her previous school and how delighted she is to be able to bring this to Meadowhead. Y11 student Abi, who has been supported by them since September, confirmed that they are 'normal people' of all ages who are "really good listeners". Abi gave this advice to other students who might be sceptical – "give it a try, it's amazing".

Our Y7 students have made an excellent and positive


start to their time at Meadowhead and we are pleased to show you students enjoying their Art, Design and Technology lessons. The Y7 student parliament representatives met for the first time

As part of a Royal Society of Engineering project, some of our

Year 8 students had the opportunity to work with students from other schools to build a four-wheeled all terrain robot able to lift and manoeuvre items. The pupils also learnt about coding and careers in the robotics sector.

Miss Deal's **Computer Club** have been going into Bradway Primary to teach their pupils and teacher how to use the Lego Mindstorm kits,



which we lent out to Bradway as one of our Trust Partner schools. This has been a

great way to encourage younger pupils into STEM and robotics in particular, and they really enjoyed it!

Y7 and Y8 After School STEM Clubs started this term with young scientists looking forward to investigating cars of the future, rocket cannons, the atom,



news & how to trust it, misinformation and identifying local issues. They then began the process of writing their own journalistic piece and will continue with two further sessions in the new year.






### Extended Learning Opportunities

to the National Citizen Service we are proud to be awarded the Champion School Gold Award. The NCS summer programme is a unique opportunity for Y11




### A Christmas Carol
