**Common Misconceptions**

In Spanish, we normally use the indefinite article ( **a** or **an** in English) before a **singular noun**. There is a **masculine** (un) and a **feminine** (una) article.

**BUT** after "no hay" [there is no...] we miss out the article

E.g hay **una** plaza - There is **a** square  
No hay plaza - There is **no** square
