

¿ Qué vas a hacer.. ?

What are you **going to** do...?

Normalmente <i>[normally]</i> A veces <i>[sometimes]</i> De vez en cuando <i>[from time to time]</i>	hago natación <i>[I go swimming]</i> juego al tenis <i>[I play tennis]</i> saco fotos <i>[I take photos]</i> descanso <i>[I relax]</i> tomo el sol <i>[I sunbathe]</i> escucho música <i>[I listen to the radio]</i>
la semana próxima <i>[next week]</i> este fin de semana <i>[this weekend]</i> el año próximo <i>[next year]</i>	voy a <i>[I'm going to]</i> vamos a <i>[we are going to]</i> hacer ... <i>[to do...]</i> jugar... <i>[to play...]</i> sacar fotos <i>[to take photos]</i> descansar... <i>[to relax]</i> tomar el sol <i>[to sunbathe]</i> escuchar... <i>[to listen...]</i>

Grammar

Infinitive verbs: An infinitive verb translates as **to do** something

e.g jugar = to play

ir = to go

comer = to eat

In Spanish, you can spot an infinitive verb easily because it ends in **-ar, -er, -ir**

TOP TIP:

HT3U3

When using 2 tenses at the same time, remember the following.

The **present** tense often ends in **O**
me llamo_ - I'm called

juego_ - I play

escucho_ - I listen

The **future** tense needs the verb **ir**
+ infinitive verb.

To say what **I'm going to do** use
voy a + infinitive

To say what **we are going to do**
use **vamos a** + infinitive

Notice that they both start with **V**
Let's think of it as the **V**uture
tense to remind to use **Voy a** or
Vamos a + infinitive
