Common Misconceptions



In Barcelona, 2 languages are spoken by the majority of the inhabitants. Spanish (Castellano) and Catalan. In Barcelona, 98% of the population speaks Castilian Spanish. About 50-60% of Barcelona's total population speaks Catalan. Barcelona is the capital of Cataluña and all signs are in both languages. People from Cataluña are fiercely proud of their national identity. Catalan is fairly similar to Spanish and has been described by some as a cross between Spanish and French.
