Grammar THE verb IR

Some **irregular verbs** don't follow this pattern, you just have to learn them as you go.

IR	to go
voy	I go / I am going
vas	you go / you are going
va	he/she goes / he or she is going

Phonics: Strong vowel a, e, o

Weak vowels i, u

When a 'strong' vowel appears next to a 'weak' vowel they make a single syllable. This means that they are pronounced together.

io = yo

ue = way

au = ow
