




## Q1. Please select the STEAM subject/s you have learnt more about during this project


### Q2. Which 5 skills you have you most developed during the project?



Q4. Which activities have you been involved in over the last 3 years of the project which have made you understand more about STEAM jobs/careers?




#### Q7. What advice would you give to a younger student considering taking part in an ERASMUS project next year?

- Just take part it's cool
- Be open for new experiences
- Students need to be aware that you need to spend a lot of time on Erasmus and the whole project! It really helps you when you want to work in a STEAM subject later and when you are motivated to learn more besides school!
- Speak Englisch. Be open.
- You should to be interested in the STEAM subjects. It's a great experience to work with students from another country
- If it is a subject related project (like steam) you should be interested in this subject but I think even if the subject is not particularly interesting for you, it's a great way to get to know people from different countries and the different working environments.
- The job interview is fun-you'll get to know someone who works in an interesting job.
- Try everything that is thrown at you and always believe that you can do it
- To take every opportunity they can get, as they never know what will or won't be beneficial
- That they should go for as many of the opportunities as they can as it's a once in a lifetime experience and it will introduce them to new friends and lots of future possibilities and give them an insight into the working world.


#### Q7. Continued...

- I would advise for younger students to make sure they listen and remember everything that is taught within the project as although it may not seem important right then, it becomes incredibly important and useful post 16.


#### Q8.List some of the jobs and careers you have developed awareness of as a result of this project

- We met lots of people and I gained a lot of confidence.


# Q10. Continued...Why were the trips to local places/events your favourite aspect?
