

Most **adjectives** go **after** the noun and have a **masculine, feminine**, **m.plural** or **f.plural** form.

Reflexive verbs have an extra bit

Reflexive pronouns

myself	me
yourself	te
him/herself	se
ourselves	nous
yourselves	vous
themselves	se

Reflexive verbs

describe **actions** that you do to **yourself**, like washing **yourself** or getting **yourself** up.

They look a bit different because they have this extra bit - a **reflexive pronoun**. It changes depending on who is doing the action.

But some adjectives come before the noun. Remember them as:

B eauty	beau/belle/beaux/belles
A ge	joli(e)(s)
G oodness	vieux/vieille/vieux/vieilles
S ize	jeune(s)
	bon(ne)(s)
	mauvais(e)(s)
	grand(e)(s)
	petit(e)(s)

Ma mère = my mother
Mon père = my father

My family

ma sœur = my sister
Mon frère = my brother
ma tante = my aunt
Mon oncle = my uncle

ma copine = my friend
Mon copain = my friend
