If you enjoyed The Boy in the Striped Pyjamas by John Boyne, and would like to read other stories set around the Holocaust and experiences of World War II, then take a look at the list below.

Some are written as novels, inspired by true events, others are historical fiction or true accounts.

Three graphic novels are included, two of which are set later but use the format to produce an accessible but hard - hitting look at periods of time through a personal viewpoint.

They are suitable for students in Y8 upwards, and for mature, confident readers in Y7
