The aim of my slides

- To give you as parents/ carers confidence to support your child through the challenges of year 11 – there is a lot going on.
- To pass on key information relating to what is happening between now and the final GCSE exams.
- To emphasise how important being in school is each day.
- To reassure you that stress is normal for students.
- To ask for your support in ensuring that the basics such as uniform are right every day.
- To ask for your support in encouraging year 11 students to attend after school and national tutoring programme sessions.

Year 11-Assessment is on-going, not all of it is about the Summer

- Many vocational subjects have assessments that count towards some or all of the final grade, taking place throughout Year 10 and Year 11 (Students who study food are currently completing their NEA).
- There is a BTEC Assessment Week 20th 25th November 2023 and a 10 hour art assessment that takes place 11th 22nd December 2023
- We also provide two sets of mock examinations in the year, 27th November 8th December 2023 and 4th 15th March 2024 both aimed at ensuring students are familiar and comfortable with the arrangements for their Summer examinations.
- They also measure a student's understanding of the work to that point and are used to encourage good revision practises ahead of them, such as attending revision sessions and planning a revision timetable.

Year 11 Summer Examinations 2024

- 'Traditional' written papers begin on the 13th May 2024 and run through until 26th June 2024 (this is a contingency day and so all students must be available up until this date)
- During this time, a typical student will sit 20+ examination papers in around 25 school days.
- We do not operate a policy of study leave (and haven't in the 15 years I have worked here)
- Most students have at least one examination paper most days.
- If they are fortunate enough to have some days without papers, we expect them in school and will provide teacher expertise, booster sessions and continue good routines ahead of their remaining papers – no dental/ doctors appointments please.

Year 11 Summer Examinations 2024

- If students miss a paper in the Summer window, they cannot take it the day after (we have had students think that this is the case in the past)
- If medical evidence cannot be provided as to why a student is absent from an examination they have been entered for, the cost of that entry will be passed on to the family. This is typically around £50 per subject.
- Missed exams= No attendance to Prom.

Support outside of the teaching day

- In Year 11, we expect all students to extend their school day beyond the 2:45 finish at least twice a week.
- There are a wide range of after school sessions that are on offer as shown on a later slide.
- I want to focus on a particular initiative entitled the National Tutoring programme.
 - Free private tuition offered by teachers for English, Maths and science.
 - The same tutor every week so they get to know your child well.
 - Small groups of students with the same target grades.
 - A weekly commitment over at least the first term of the year.



For students who do not meet school expectations, there will be levelled consequences




Form Time Curriculum – Y11







Revision Guides

- Speak to your subject teacher to find out which Tier paper you will be sitting in the final exams.
- Subject teachers may also guide you to which topics and types of books you will need for your revision.
- To order them you should log in to your My Portal account, they will be delivered to school by the external company.
- Once they arrive they will be brought to your child.
- In addition to this, the school make booklets which contain knowledge organisers for each subject.
- These Knowledge organisers are to be used during supported study to support further revision.



Tips for Parents- how can I help?

- Talk to your child about their work, check the quality, presentation, understanding, completeness and accuracy. Use as a motivational tool, weekly check in.
- Ask them to explain their work to you if you don't understand, this is a great revision tool for them.
- Make a note of key dates (see later on)
- Visit Classcharts to check their homework, Achievement points, behaviour points, attendance and punctuality.
- Support them with independent study- help them with organisation and timing, reward and praise when necessary.
