## Create a Monologue

Create a character and write a monologue for them. A monologue is where a character speaks their thoughts aloud for the audience. Think carefully about

where the character is when they are delivering the monologue, what they would be wearing and what they would have on stage with them. You could draw these and write them down or you could use clothes and objects in your own home as props. Rehearse the monologue and use the costumes and props to make it as realistic a performance as possible. Rehearse over and over and try your best to learn the words. Think carefully about the character's body language, facial expression and voice.
